FEDERAL, STATE & LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES ARE WORKING 24/7 TO PROTECT US AND KEEP OUR WEST COAST PORTS SAFE, BUT THEY NEED OUR HELP

The Coast Guard is leading the effort in Port Security. As they continue to assess the threat level in each Port and take appropriate action they have asked all of us to continue to do the following:

- Maintain a heightened security posture at all Port facilities. This includes dock & ship side, terminals, and dispatch halls
- Report any abnormal behavior or actions
- Be aware of emergency procedures for medical emergency, fire and bomb threats.
- Report any specific threats to facility/vessel/port areas.

The Coast Guard has been working with all waterfront employers to implement these security measures.

The Coast Guard is coordinating maritime security efforts with other law enforcement and regulatory agencies. The FBI, US Customs, Port and Local Police Departments are increasing patrols on and around our terminals.
