Security Flyer # 2 continues the series entitled "Security Awareness". This information will better prepare you to properly respond to any security situation or incident.

2. "BE AWARE OF DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES AND DEVICES."

- Dangerous substances and devices might include any material substance, or item that may cause damage or injury to any person, vessel, facility, harbor, port, or waters that:
- 1. Is unlawful to possess under applicable Federal, State, or local law;
- 2. Has not been approved for entry onto the vessel or facility; or
- 3. Has not been approved for entry onto the public area, property in a port by the Government.

Some examples of dangerous substances/devices are:

- 1. A bomb shipped hidden in a container;
- 2. Various hazardous materials that could be stolen and used for harm, (such as a fertilizer and fuel oil bomb used at the Oklahoma City Federal building).
- 3. Chemicals which could be released and used as weapons of mass destruction.
- 4. Illegal weapons such as automatic weapons, explosives etc.
- U.S. Customs is responsible for regulations to prevent the use of intermodal containers to illegally transport any weapon, dangerous device or substance.
- U.S Customs is constantly alert to any illegal activity.
- U.S Customs uses the Vehicle and Container Inspection Systems (VACIS), Radiation Detection Portals, and sophisticated computers and technology for cargo screening.

3. "BE AWARE OF THE CHARACTERISTICS AND BEHAVIORAL PATTERNS OF PERSONS WHO ARE LIKELY TO THREATEN SECURITY."

Be Aware & Alert For:

- Someone who seems not to be familiar with our terminals or seems to be out of place.
- A person trying to gain entrance without proper identification, or
- Someone tampering with containers, tanks, cranes, power supplies, or other critical terminal systems.

OK...SO WHAT DOES ALL THIS REALLY MEAN TO LONGSHORE WORKERS ON THE JOB?

Your the one on the job, working ever day.....You know the terminal, equipment, chassis & cargo You know who and what is "normal".

If you see anything out of the ordinary, anything that does not look right or looks out of place:

"Get Away, Call Supervision and Report It Then follow the instructions from your Supervisor".

Management has developed a Facility Security Plan in accordance with the U.S. Coast Guard Regulations that has been designed to handle these type of incidents. Remember "Get Away & Notify Supervision". Do not do anything more than provide information. Do not try to stop any illegal activity.
