

BE ALERT - BE VIGILANT! - WATCH FOR...



- Unauthorized person tampering with a seal on a container
- Someone climbing over the fence
- · An unauthorized vehicle in the yard
- A person without proper ID
- Unusual photographic activity
- Divers near a vessel
- Unusual night operations
- Changes or lack of usually observed security
- Any suspicious activity on the terminal or



5. AWARENESS OF SECURITY REGULATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS MAN-DATED BY THE GOVERNMENT.

"Government Security Regulations and Requirements" that you should be aware of:

Employers must:

- Have a terminal security plan This plan is not releasable.
- Take security precautions based on the Coast Guard MARSEC level.
- Establish procedures for reporting all security incidents.
- Establish procedures for responding to a security incident and terminal evacuation
- Have a Security Training Program General Safety Training V.

Persons entering a facility must:

- Identify themselves (Show approved ID Card).
- Have a reason to be on the facility Proper Dispatch.
- Submit to screening person, vehicle, & baggage when requested.

The Coast Guard may cite anyone who violates security regulations.
